Project Chaverim Fellowship Application CSAIR

The Project Chaverim Fellowship of the CSAIR Marsha Dane Hebrew School funded by a grant from the Jewish Education Project. This program includes training a cohort of 10^{th} - 12^{th} graders to teach Hebrew reading and selected T'filot (prayers) to the Hebrew School 3^{rd} and 4th grade classes. The experience includes group activities, "chevruta" (paired) style instruction and several out-of-building activities. Teen Fellows will work with the 3^{rd} and 4^{th} graders on Sunday mornings. The hours are 10am – 12pm. This is a paid position.

Requirements for Project Chaverim Fellows:

- 1. Fellows must be available to be at CSAIR on Sundays from 10am 12pm.
- 2. Fellows must be able to read Hebrew and have a basic knowledge of selected T'filot.
- 3. Fellows must be able to work well with 3rd and 4th graders, their peers and accept coaching and instruction from an adult.
- 4. Fellows must be willing to participate in all training, class meetings and outings unless making special arrangements.
- 5. Fellows must be willing to represent the values of CSAIR and the guidelines set forth in the Project Chaverim Fellowship.

Benefits of becoming a Project Chaverim Fellow:

- 1. Fellows will acquire skills in Hebrew and T'filot instruction. These skills may be used later to obtain a position as a Hebrew School teacher.
- 2. Fellows will work closely with their peers and a coach to develop innovative, creative and meaningful experiences for their 3rd or 4th grade partner.
- 3. Fellows will be recognized by the Hebrew School and the CSAIR congregation for their contribution toward the Jewish Education of our community.
- 4. Fellows have the opportunity to be an integral part of an innovative experiment in congregational education.
- 5. Fellows will be paid for their participation in the project.
