We will look deeply at qualities such as gratitude (modim/karat et ha'tov), honesty (emet), forgiveness (t'shuvah), loving-kindness (chesed), honor (kavod), equanimity (hishtavut), humility (anavah), silence (sh'tikah), enthusiasm (zerizut), hospitality (hachnasat orchim), trust/faith (bitachon/emunah), order (seder) and others through the teachings of Torah, Pirke Avot, Mussar and Chasidut.
