Position Overview

The Jewish Education Project seeks a full-time **Manager, Online Educational Content**, a key team member responsible for managing the execution of the agency's digital initiatives.

Reporting to the Managing Director of Educational Technology and Strategy, the successful candidate **will be able to draw upon personal teaching experience to be a content curator and creator** responsible for researching, compiling, and adapting curriculum, digital information, stories, articles, images, webpages, and videos for inclusion in our resource offerings. S/he will be responsible for managing the entire life cycle of educational digital assets within the organization. Close collaboration with content partners and with internal multidisciplinary teams will be required. The ideal candidate will be able to manage a complex project with multiple stakeholders, including users, partner organizations, and third-party design and development firms. Candidates with diverse racial, cultural, educational backgrounds and experiences are urged to apply.

Key Responsibilities:

- Coordinate with team members, resource and organizational partners/providers and subject matter experts to develop, create and/or curate content for the platform; align and discern content quality and integrity.
- Manage inquiries from/through the portal; use project management skills, tools, and timelines to ensure deadlines are met.
- Support program focused colleagues in leveraging the portal technology for The Jewish Education Project professional development experiences.
- Research, evaluate and select digital assets such as stories, articles, webpages, MOOCs, images, and videos, from a wide variety of online sources; Writing, editing, curating, and discovering additional educational resources.
- Design and facilitate small and large group training activities as needed.
- Ensure best design and format consistently across all deliverables.
- Keep digital assets current, accessible, and updated as new versions are released.
- Research emerging trends and technologies in educational products and digital content creation and curation; project manage subsequent site design modifications and enhancements.
- Assist in the implementation of e-courses using proven methodologies including the comprehensive integration of digital technologies (VR, video lectures, games, interactive assessments, instructional videos, e-learning, etc.) to achieve desired learning outcomes.

Experience, Qualifications, and Competencies

Our ideal candidate has experience teaching in part-time Jewish educational settings as well as in online research, digital content curation and curriculum development. The candidate will have technological savvy across multiple platforms, devices, and digital resources. A passion and enthusiasm for Jewish educational content and an ability to maintain focus and motivation throughout the completion of repetitive tasks are also needed to succeed in this position. Specifically:

- Deep familiarity with Jewish educational landscape.
- Minimum 3-5 years' experience teaching in a Jewish educational environment, including Hebrew school, camp, day school; at least 1-year of experience in digital or other content curation, EdTech, or related role preferred.
- Knowledge of systems for project management, such as Asana, Trello, or Monday.
- Knowledge of systems for the design and development of web-based technology, such as Github, Adobe XD, and Figma.
- Familiarity with platforms that support digital learning, beyond the field of Jewish Education.
- Familiarity with curriculum development, lesson plans, online learning market and/or other pedagogies.
- Fluency, competency and literacy in multiple digital platforms and technology, preferably instructional design, with the ability to quickly grasp new technologies.
- Ability to effectively manage multiple projects at the same time, prioritize tasks, identify, and mitigate risks, and meet tight deadlines while still maintaining high-quality work.
- Ability to obtain a minimal level of academic mastery of the educational subject matter being curated to ensure high-quality appraisal and selection of assets.
- Creative and inquisitive, able to think beyond the traditional educational landscape to use digital technology to influence Jewish education of tomorrow.
- Ability to make decisions and sound judgments on content with limited information available.
- Ability to work collaboratively and effectively with a multidisciplinary team with a strong execution and service orientation and proven project management skills.
- Clear and effective communicator with strong writing and editing skills.
- Bachelor's degree required. A Master's degree in Jewish Education/Education preferred.
